

“Isaac, who had a taste for wild game, loved Esau, but Rebekah loved Jacob.” (Gen.25:28)

*‘Rebekah was listening as Isaac spoke to **his** son Esau... Rebekah said to **her** son Jacob, “Look, I overheard **your** father say to **your** brother Esau...”’ (Gen 27:5,6)*
